

The Leicester Marriages are taken from the five ancient parishes of Leicester comprising of All Saints, St. Margaret's, St. Martin's, which became the Leicester Cathedral in 1927, St. Mary de Castro, popularly known as St. Mary's and St. Nicholas. The parish of St. Leonard's which consisted of Abbey Gate Wood Gate and part of Frog Island became inactive when the church was destroyed in the Civil War in the time of Charles the 1st, most of the marriages since have been performed at either All Saints or St. Margaret's, a new church was erected and consecrated in 1877.

There are several extraparochial places and liberties in Leicester the main ones being; Black Friars, Castle View, The Newarke and St. Augustine Friars.

In Leicestershire all the parishes are included, along with Netherseal which is now part of Derbyshire where the parish registers are kept. The villages of Donisthorpe, Measham, Ravenstone and Stretton en le Field were in Derbyshire and are now in Leicestershire.

Little Bowden was in Northamptonshire and is now in Leicestershire, so therefore they are shown as Leicestershire. Place names have been spelt in the way that they are today.
